On behalf of all eight Knights of Columbus Councils around Billings, it is my honor to invite you to the 116th Annual Montana Council State Convention April 30- May 2, 2020, in Billings, MT. Our planning committee has been working hard to make sure that the convention will be a wonderful experience to all those who attend. We are striving to limit the travel during the convention.

Our Committee has chosen Billings Hotel and Convention Center (BHCC) at 1223 Mallowney Lane in Billings, as our convention site. This venue choice will allow us to keep the bulk of convention activities in one building. General Sessions, meetings, some of the Ladies' programs, meals during the convention, and both Friday morning and Saturday evening Masses will be held at BHCC. For the limited off-site activities, a bus has also been reserved to shuttle ladies during their outings, and for all guests to and from an open house at the Columbia Club.

A block of 150 rooms has been reserved for us at BHCC. They have given us a special convention rate for our rooms of \$99/night + tax. There are also a number of other hotels/motels in close proximity to the BHCC. Our Faith in Action

Council 13093 had a Thanksgiving Basket and duffel bag program. Homeless veterans received a duffel bag with warm weather goods and toiletries. 85 food baskets went to the needy in the Bitterroot valley.

Council 6130 did Coats for Kids and adults at the several drop points in Hamilton. They also did a Christmas party for the parish after the Christmas Pageant. A Second and Third Degree Exemplification will be held in February. The annual Free Throw Competition for the Bitterroot Valley will be held January 22nd. The Bitterroot Valley Winter Special Olympics will be held January 27-28th at Lost Trail Ski area.

Council 2464 at the suggestion of the Parish Priest and Council Chaplain, Fr. Amalraj, the Knights created a "Remembrance Tree" and its stand. It was placed in the sanctuary of the church during the month of November. Being similar to the "Jesse Tree" in Advent, instead of ornaments being hung on the tree, pictures of the dearly departed were placed upon it. We "Remembered Our Deceased" throughout the month of November.

The council participated in the "KofC Coats for Kids" program. Having met the needs of the Roundup Schools, the Council contacted the outlying schools in its assigned jurisdiction of St. Benedicts. Coats were supplied for, Melstone (Our Lady of Mercy), Winnett (St. Aloysius), Ryegate (St. Mathias), and Broadview (St. Theresa of the Little Flower.)

Council 1021 did a Light for Christ program in Missoula.

Council 844 will host **Consecration** to the Holy Family. Families today face many cultural pressures and personal struggles that accompany family life. Families also have a great capacity for love and joy that is strengthened through the peace and truth found in Christ. To support and help families live out this joy, the Knights will be sponsoring a prayer of *Consecration to the Holy Family* at the 11:00AM Mass on December 29th,

which is the Feast of the Holy Family. Prayer cards will be handed out by Greeters before Mass. Following Mass, *Complete My Joy* booklets will be available in the back of the Cathedral by the Great Doors. It is part of the "Building the Domestic Church" series and is intended to help families grow spiritually in service of God, parish and each other.

Council 1413 did a project to Change public hearts and minds about family, marriage, religious freedom and life issues.

Goals: Provide visible & financial support for the Montana Family Foundation during their Annual Fundraising Banquet.

This project benefits our families, our community and our culture by standing up at the state and local levels for public policies related to family, marriage, religious freedom and the sanctity of life.

Laws promoting abortion, euthanasia, assisted suicide, same-sex marriage and sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI) are being proposed. The MT Family Foundation works with the Cities, the State Legislature and the Judicial System on behalf of families, marriage, and the dignity of life human.

Council 9395 In recognition of "*World Day of the Poor*" observed on November 19th, *Worthy Grand Knight Billy Ross & Brother John Gort*, Council #9395 in Great Falls spearheaded their council's drive to reach out and help those in need. Their council delivered a trailer full of food, approximately 1,000 pounds, and 160 of the new premium extreme weather winter coats to the *Little Flower Catholic Church* in Browning, MT, for distribution to members of the Blackfeet Tribe. The donation of coats was part of Council #9395's 5th Annual "*Coats for Kids*" winter coats give-away project. Council #1493, also in Great Falls was invited to "partner- in" and took part in this event by contributing mittens, gloves and hats as part of the give-away items.

In addition, the councils conducted a second very successful "*Coats for Kids*" winter coats

give-away session on November 23rd at the *Saint Vincent de Paul's Thrift Store* in Great Falls.

Altogether, Council #9395 acquired approximately \$8,000.00 worth of new winter coats for their annual charitable event to benefit the needy in the community.

A “*Superb*” charity motivated accomplishment by both Councils.

Council 8345 Billings Heights Council donated \$1,100 raised by a fund drive to Eagle Mount Billings, an outdoor recreational center for children and adults with physical and intellectual disabilities. (This blurb appears in the December 2019 *COLUMBIA* magazine.)
