How can we truly put our Faith in action as Easter approaches and beyond?

Have you ever asked the members of your Council, the District Deputies, Chairmen and Directors in your state or even your State Officers: "How many of you are Converts"?

When I have seen this question asked in any large gathering of Knights, I am always surprised by the large number of hands that are raised. That is the good news and we are blessed and made stronger by that.

Now the bad news. I have heard polls that tell us that, on average, of those entering the Church this Easter, by next Easter 50% to 75% WILL NOT be attending Mass regularly.

Why might that be? Because the evil one and his minions HATE when Christ gains another soul, another family, another Faithful Catholic and they fight in earnest to erode the conviction, to smother the enthusiasm, to amplify the doubts and the fears, to kill the joy and the excitement of these new Catholics.

Many of you have worked in and with the OCIA/RCIA programs in your Parishes. Many of you have been the sponsor for one or more new Catholics as they journey into the Church so you know.

For those of us lucky enough to have been born into the Catholic Church but who haven't participated in this process, have you ever thought about the progression, the prayer, the spiritual development and finally the joy of finding and working your way into the Church?

Have you really thought about the other side of that too? Have you thought about the upset and the frustration of leaving the faith and faith community you have known and been nurtured in? A faith community that perhaps generations of one's family has known and supported and thrived in?

Have you considered that there is perhaps anger and resentment at God for opening one's mind and heart to the fullness of the faith in the Catholic Church but also finding in one's heart that there is really other way to be faithful than to go where God leads? What about the terrible loss so many of our separated brothers and sisters must contemplate, discover, face and hopefully overcome in choosing to come into full communion with the Catholic Church? The loss of the fellowship, friendship and security they have known in their faith communities and traditions. The very real threat of economic loss due to the ending of jobs, contacts and careers. The terrible possibility of the estrangement of friends and family, perhaps forever.

We can't fully ward off or eliminate any of these realities that our soon-to-be joined with us brothers and sisters may well have to face but we can be a light, a refuge, a support system as they venture beyond the classes, the retreats and yes, the safety of the OCIA/RCIA program in our Parishes. HOW you may ask. By offering the fellowship of our Order! By inviting them and their families to our events. By providing the opportunities for them and their families to put their newly fulfilled faith into action; concrete, biblical, Gospel-inspired action of feeding the hungry, clothing the naked and consoling the sick and the imprisoned.

We can provide the fellowship they may have lost in their former faith community. We can be the contacts for business and the referrals for jobs. We can and should be their new friends and truly family members that may be missing from the move. And finally asking them and their families to join our family and become members, we

can offer them the full benefits we as an Order have to protect themselves and their families. That way they can not only grow with us in faith, but with us, can protect their both their spiritual and financial wellbeing.

Please, each Council through the Grand Knight, the Council Chancellor or the Council Faith Director contact your Parish Priest or DRE and get in front of the OCIA/RCIA programs and offer the Order to them. If this is too late, get the contact list of those new Catholics who came into the Church at the Easter Vigil and talk to them and their families.

Don't leave these new Catholic out in the cold to forge for themselves a new life as part of the Catholic Church.

This is a real chance to save souls, to be the armor of God and to offer the sword of prayer and the shield of good works formed by faith to all the members of our Church.
