As we continue to save lives and support life across Montana with our adoption services, mental health counseling and education, and Baby Boutique diaper banks, please know that working to serve others alongside the Knights of Columbus is an honor, especially since our missions align so closely.

If you recall to last year, CSSM offered the first-ever statewide fishing tournament. It was open to Knights and the public. This year, with all the work being done at CSSM, I plan to draw back this fundraising competition and offer it exclusively to the council members of the Knights of Columbus. It will likely limit the amount of participants and accept them on a first-come, first-serve basis. Council 1644 has made amazing progress towards providing life-saving ultrasounds across the hi-line. The board of directors for this project include 1644's Grand Knight, 2 doctors from St Jude's parish in Havre, Monsignor Dan Wathen, and a couple of other members, and have filed for non-profit status. The project is doing business as *Aurora Pregnancy Support*, is searching for a paid director, and hopes to acquire a mobile unit soon to provide the ultrasounds. One for all Knights of Columbus councils out there, and one specifically for those in the areas of Glasgow, Lewistown, Conrad, and Shelby.

- 1. We believe the model we are using can be imitated by other councils who feel inspired to be active in saving lives. We are open to working with your council if you are ready to take on a project like this.
- 2. We need trained sonographers and would appreciate referrals from any of the areas mentioned above.

There is no better way to "proclaim life" than by sharing the sound of a heartbeat and the image of life in the womb. Together, we can save lives!

Supreme Council Supporting Montana

This election season, the Supreme Council donated \$50,000 to support the battle against CI-128. While this tragic amendment passed, it is still important to note that Supreme was active in supporting the Montana Knights of Columbus, Montana Catholic Conference, and the Dioceses in their fight against it.

ASAP

With the passing of CI-128 last November, it's more important than ever for councils to continue to support their local pregnancy centers or Catholic Social Services of Montana through the ASAP program. Supporting these organizations is an excellent way to combat the attack on life in our world and state, as these entities walk together with mothers and families choosing or considering choosing life. Without their work, many mothers would not have the resources that empower them to choose to parent or choose adoption, instead of making the grave mistake of choosing abortion, which will haunt them for the rest of their lives. Some of these organizations continue to help families after the birth of the child if they need it, as well, with the goal of creating stable, healthy, and loving families for the children involved. As a reminder, for every \$500, up to \$2000, donated to a pregnancy center or CSSM Supreme will match \$100. This turns a donation of \$2000 into \$2400.


